Ceremony Notes

Processional and Recessional Guidelines:

McMurry University asks that you read and be mindful of a few guidelines in order for the commencement ceremony to be safe and respectful at all times:

- After the ceremony has ended, please wait for the graduates to process out before leaving.
- Please follow all staff instructions and posted signs at all times.
- For the Recessional, please rise and remain standing until the graduates and faculty have exited. Do not block the exit.

Academic Honors Designations:

† Member of the James Winford Hunt Chapter of Alpha Chi National Honor Society.

Honors listed in the program are computed through the end of the previous semester. At the time of graduation, a student is designated for honors based on the following cumulative grade point average: Summa Cum Laude -- 3.85-4.0; Magna Cum Laude -- 3.7-3.84; Cum Laude --3.5-3.69. To be eligible for graduation with academic honors, a student must have completed a minimum of fifty-seven semester hours in resident courses at McMurry University.

Departmental Honors graduates have completed a senior thesis in an academic discipline, usually the student's major field, with the endorsement of the faculty members of that department, and maintained a grade point average of at least 3.25.

University Honors Program graduates have fulfilled all requirements for Departmental Honors, maintained a grade point average of at least 3.5, and completed several honors classes in other areas of the university curriculum.

Academic Dress

Academic regalia derive from two garments, a type of robe and a hood or head covering worn in the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. Since the clergy composed the majority of the educated class, academic dress is an adaptation of the cape that was worn for warmth in unheated buildings and in religious processions.

Through the years, great diversity in color and style of cap, gown, and hood developed until 1895 when an intercollegiate code was adopted in the United States to encourage standard designs and usage. An academic costume consists of three items: the gown, the hood, and the Oxford cap or mortar board. Their sleeves easily distinguish gowns. The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves. The sleeves of a master's gown are oblong panels reaching nearly to the hem of the gown. A doctor's gown has full and bell-shaped sleeves which carry three horizontal bars; it also has a velvet panel extending around the neck and down from the front of the hem. The velvet trim is usually black but may be of the color associated with the degree.

Hoods for the master's and doctor's regalia are similar. The former are shorter and are trimmed with a narrower velvet band. Color of the trim of a hood identifies the wearer's degree: brown, fine arts; dark blue, philosophy; buff, business; golden yellow, science; light blue, education; orange, engineering; pink, music; apricot, nursing; white, arts and letters; and scarlet, theology. Color of the hood lining identifies the institution that conferred the degree.

The Oxford cap, commonly called the mortar board, is black and has a long tassel that is fastened by a button on the top. Doctors wear a gold tassel.

Mace

Once a familiar weapon in medieval combat, the mace evolved over time into a symbol of rulership and became associated with the pride of a nation and its origins. Later the mace was adopted by universities as a symbol of the power of the academic quest for truth and wisdom.

The mace that leads the procession is a symbol of McMurry's rich history. The base of the wooden staff holds bands signifying each president of the university. In the center of the staff lies an inlaid eagle feather symbolizing strength and purpose.

The globe of the mace captures the essence of the university. The Zuni bowl represents the Native American heritage of Dr. J.W. Hunt, McMurry's founding father, who lived on the Kaw Indian Reservation as a child. At the crest of the globe is the United Methodist cross and flame, symbolic of our strong ties and heritage within the United Methodist Church.

The mace was designed and cast by Terry Gilbreth, sculptor, and a 1968 graduate of McMurry University.

Presidential Medallion

The Presidential medallion consists of the McMurry University seal displaying the founding date of 1923 in maroon. Dr. Harper's starting date of October 1, 2013, as the President of McMurry University, is engraved on the reverse side.

Cords

Cords are symbolic of a student's achievements throughout their academic career. They allow the audience to visually recognize graduates who have completed an academic honor, those who have participated in certain academic societies or clubs, or graduating from a particular school or department within the institution that grants graduation cords as keepsakes for that degree program. Dr. Paul FabrizioCommencement Speaker

Dr. Paul Fabrizio is a Professor of Political Science at McMurry University. Born and raised in southern California, he received his Associate of Arts degree from Santa Ana College and his bachelor's degree in political science from the University of Southern California. He worked for several years as an automotive market researcher at J.D. Power & Associates in Los Angeles, and as a manager for the U.S. Census Bureau in Baltimore. He then received his master's and doctoral degrees from Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia, and taught at Darton College in Georgia before moving to Texas to join McMurry's faculty in 1996.

Paul has had a varied career at McMurry. In addition to being a professor, he was named dean of the School of Arts & Letters in 2007 and in 2010 was selected as the vice president for academic affairs, a position he served in for five years. He also has assisted McMurry in several interim roles, including dean of students, athletic director, and president. From 2005 to 2020 he was co-host of the local political radio talk show, "The Professors" with the late McMurry Professor Rev. Dr. Bill Libby. He is also a frequent guest on local news stations, state and nationwide publications, and international radio shows speaking about politics and elections. He also is host of the Division of Humanities, Religion, and Social Sciences' podcast, "McMurry Minds."

In his career, Paul has been honored with several awards including the Abilene Young Lawyer's Association's Liberty Bell Award and McMurry's own Gordon R. and Lola J. Bennett Award for Outstanding Teaching, Service, and Leadership. McMurry graduates have twice awarded him their Faculty Appreciation Award, and he has received the Outstanding Faculty Award and the Outstanding Administrator Award during his twenty-eight years here.

Paul and his wife of 31 years, Ginger, have two children; Robert and Juliana both graduated from McMurry and reside in Abilene.
